Throughout 2017 COHI worked tirelessly to achieve "Oral Health for All." We believe that oral health is a basic right for all Connecticut residents across the lifespan. COHI was active in policy, advocacy and training arenas to ensure that oral health, as critical to general health, remains integral to all health-related planning and implementation efforts.

During the legislative session, we supported maintaining Medicaid eligibility and reimbursement rates; requiring cultural competency training for dental hygienists; and increasing oral health knowledge for community health workers. COHI supported bills that would decrease the use of to-bacco and tobacco-like products, and the consumption of sugar-added beverages. COHI participated in the implementation of the State Health Improvement Plan and State Innovative Model. In addition, we have conducted advocacy trainings, collaborated on two oral health summits, and held another successful COHI Golf Classic.

# **Primary Advocacy Goals for 2017**

**Goal 1**: Maintain comprehensive dental coverage and current eligibility under Medicaid for adults and children in Connecticut to maintain access to dental care for the state's low-income children and adults.

- No additional cuts to Children's Dental Medicaid program in the 2017 Legislative Session;
- Eligibility for HUSKY A parents was reduced to 135%FPL, with legislators committing to roll back the cuts in 2018;
- An annual \$1000 cap on Medicaid adult dental benefits was passed but amended to offer the ability to provide services beyond the cap with prior authorization.
- The State Budget contains cuts to the Medicare Savings Plan which would impact the ability for covered persons to pay for dental care.
  - COHI joined others asking for a repeal:
    - The implementation was delayed from January 1 to March 1, 2018;
    - the legislature stated they will call a Special Session to address the harmful cuts for the beginning of January 2018;

**Goal 2**: Promote integration of oral health into health systems to increase access to preventive care and referral to a dental home.

- Discussions held to integrate oral health measures into the Core Set of SIM. There are a number of roadblocks in SIM for changes to any quality measures;
- Oral health was included as a component of Community Health Worker (CHW) curriculum being developed by DPH:
  - ♦ COHI became a member of the CHW Oral Health Advisory Committee;
  - DPH contracted COHI to develop a training module for CHW on oral health advocacy.

**Goal 3:** Increase the number of adults aged 19 to 26 years covered by dental insurance to provide continuity of dental care into adulthood.

- Substitute HB 5971: An Act Extending the Period Children, Stepchildren and other Dependent Children May Retain Dental Insurance Coverage under a Parents' or Legal Guardian's Insurance Policy was raised and received a joint favorable report and referral to the Appropriations Committee;
- COHI received assurance that the bill will be proposed next year.

**Goal 4:** Increase cultural competency for dental providers to address health disparities.

- PA 17-146 requires registered dental hygienists to receive at least one contact hour of education in cultural competency for license renewal;
- COHI held a first cultural competency course on October 20 as demonstration of a quality course.

# Goal I. Provide a dynamic focus for broad based oral health advocacy efforts in Connecticut.

- Develop and support a comprehensive advocacy agenda with measureable outcomes.
- Enhance COHI's presence at the Capitol around oral health issues with legislature, agencies and the governor's office.
- Track, monitor and advocate for legislation and regulatory policies with potential to positively impact oral health care for underserved populations.

# Goal II. Strengthen COHI's position as a community partner, change agent and recognized expert in oral health.

- Identify and participate in the appropriate national, state and local coalitions or partnerships as deemed vital to COHI's mission.
- Integrate oral health in the planning and advocacy efforts of targeted federal, state and local health agencies.
- Encourage stakeholders to take effective actions to maintain or increase oral health access and /or quality of care.
- Improve communications with stakeholders around advocacy issues.

# Goal III. Enhance COHI's governance and capacity to support strategic objectives.

- Sustain an effective governance structure that supports COHI's mission and strategic plan.
- Expand directors appropriate knowledge by attending professional development programs.
- Recruit two new board members with consideration for diversity and appropriate skills to support COHI's mission and strategic plans.
- Meet best practices for nonprofit governance by developing and reviewing needed policies to ensure accountability.
- Develop and sustain staff structure that supports COHI's mission and strategic plans.
- Improve the communication and IT structure to support COHI.

# Goal IV. Develop and implement the long-term sustainability plan.

- Secure adequate funding to support COHI's programming and staffing needs.
- Draw on COHIs successes in developing requests for funding and inkind resources.
- Implement an organizational/funding non-profit model for COHI sustainability.
